UNIVERSITY OF IOWA RELATED FUNDING

College of Law Public Interest Award (two grants awarded)

The Public Interest Summer Internship Class of 1998 Fund was established by the Class of 1998 to support students who pursue summer internships at public interest organizations. Recipients must be a currently enrolled law student and must demonstrate procurement of summer employment in public interest law, an area that includes Internal Revenue Code 501(c)(3) entities, government agencies, and advocacy groups. Projected summer employment compensation must be either low or unpaid. The applicant's level of need and the intensity of commitment to public interest law are the primary criteria for selection. Academic achievement will not be considered a factor. A committee of faculty and staff selects recipients.

Any University of Iowa College of Law student who has secured public interest employment (with nonprofits, government entities, or other organizations) for the summer of 2008 is eligible to apply for an Equal Justice Foundation grant. PILI – Chicago Public Interest Internships Only

Each year, PILI offers over 40 public interest law internships that provide excellent legal training and experience for first or second year law students. Interns work at one of PILI's affiliated public interest law agencies in Chicago. PILI raises the money to fund the internships and then issues grants to its eligible host agencies. The agencies, in turn, pay their Interns directly. PILI ensures quality supervision by experienced lawyers at its agencies, and provides a lunchtime educational seminar program. The Internship program encourages law students to work at --and learn about-- legal institutions that serve the public interest, and engenders a life-long commitment to public interest law and pro bono work.

PILI sponsors a Summer Internship Program for first and second year law students. The Summer Internship program is open to law students from across the country. Each summer, PILI funds dozens of internships at public interest law agencies in the Chicago metropolitan area. Agencies hosting Summer Interns receive \$5,000 to pay an Intern for 10 full-time weeks of work.

Equal Justice Works Fellowship

Provides financial support to graduation law students and practicing lawyers who wish to work for two years at a sponsoring organization on “innovative, effective legal advocacy on behalf of individuals, groups, or issues that are not adequately represented by some aspect of the legal system.” They are not used to fund a general staff attorney position, but instead, offer fellows the opportunity to exercise leadership on a discrete project. They encourage projects that can be replicated in other communities; which serve a large number of clients; and which are sustainable. Fellows receive a stipend equal to the starting salary of an attorney at their sponsoring organization up to 39,000. Some loan repayment assistance may also be available. This nonprofit corporation, affiliated with the Women Lawyers Association of Los Angeles, grew out of the recognition of the scarcity of public funding legal assistance. The Foundation provides summer grants to law students who work in the public interest. Grants fund specific independent projects, usually pursued in conjunction with nonprofit agencies. May not be used to support a summer externship at an organization.
